

Recommended PowerPoint file formats for use with MyHYPERTrack LMS

This document lists some recommended file types to save your PowerPoint presentations to for use with the MyHYPERTrack LMS. If you plan on using a lot of PowerPoint files with your system, we recommend you check out a product called ISpring Presenter. It converts the PowerPoint file to a FLASH format. FLASH is a good web format for displaying content on the web.

NOTE: YOUR BROWSER MAY NEED TO HAVE A PLUG-IN, ADD-ON, OR VIEWER INSTALLED BEFORE YOU CAN VIEW THE FOLLOWING FILE FORMATS

Movie (.mov) Note: creates very large single file that will take longer to upload
Exports the presentation to a movie file that you can play in the QuickTime Player.

Web Page (.htm)

Saves the presentation for display on the Web. HTML is the default Web format and can be displayed by Macintosh and Windows browsers.

PowerPoint Show (.ppsx)

Saves as an XML-based presentation that always opens in slide show view. Compatible with PowerPoint 2008 for Mac and PowerPoint 2007 for Windows.

PowerPoint 97-2004 Show (.pps)

Saves as a presentation that always opens in slide show view. Compatible with PowerPoint 98 through PowerPoint 2004 for Mac and PowerPoint 97 through PowerPoint 2003 for Windows.

OTHER FORMATS

PDF - Exports the presentation to a PDF file, which looks the same on Macintosh and Windows computers.

JPEG - Exports each slide to a graphic file that other applications can open.

PNG - Exports each slide to a graphic file that other applications can open.

GIF - Exports each slide to a graphic file that other applications can open.

BMP - Exports each slide to a graphic file that other applications can open.

TIFF - Exports each slide to a graphic file that other applications can open.
